



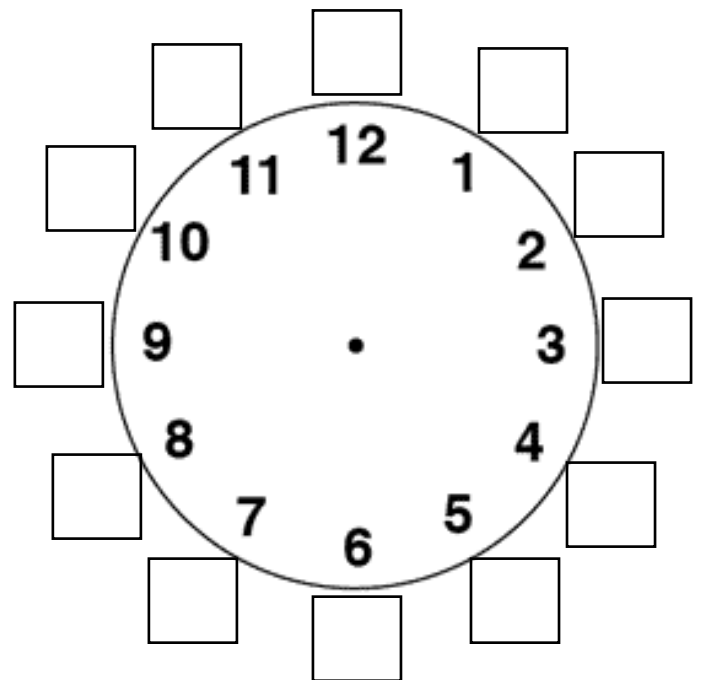
Romans in Rochester
